Dear beneficiary:

Due to the emergency caused by the passage of the Hurricanes Irma and Maria, the Department of Health's Medicaid Program has decided to extend the health coverage for an additional year. This only applies to those beneficiaries whose eligibility expired or expires during the months of September 2017 to June 2018. That is, if your eligibility expired or expires at:

You do not need to go to our office to re-evaluate unless:

- There has been a change in your family nucleus. Some of the changes that need to be reported are when you or one of the members of your family: (1) is pregnant, (2) was pregnant and gave birth or lost the baby, (3) got married, (4) is incarcerated, includes a state or federal jail, a forensic psychiatric hospital or a juvenile institution), (5) has died, (6) moved to the United States or another country.
- You or one of the members of your household has had a decrease in monthly income of 10 percent or more.
- The Program send you an appointment because the needs to clarify some information about you or one of your family household.

Before you or your family member's eligibility expires, you will receive an appointment letter for re-evaluation.
